How have you worked with Engineering to accommodate timelines and feature delivery?
Monica, Thank you for your presence today. SAS has many different approaches. Can you please provide more information on your specific SAS journey? For instance, which SAS Certifications did you obtain? How do you use SAS in your daily work? Thank you.	I did not do any certifications. I identified areas of learning and studied through various resources. For example —  AWS — read material online, watched some youtube videos, and then created my own AWS instances and played around with it.  Distributed Databases — read up from various sources, did a coursera course on mongo DB, installed on my system and did basic examples. I also focused on learning the different types of non-relational databases, pros and cons of each and why I would choose one in a particular situation. There are several youtube videos from conferences where companies talk about their use cases.  Kafka — took a course and studied use cases. Focused on when to use sync vs async
	messaging. Best practices when using Kafka CI-CD pipelines – this was mostly reading, and I did not go very deep into it. Just basic understanding of various technologies.  Microservices architecture – I spend a lot of time in design of distributed architectures. Took the https://www.educative.io/ "Grokking the System Design Interview" and several other courses from them. Watched several resources on how to design good systems and the pitfalls encountered. Frankly, I did not find a lot of good real world designs, so I spend time with my husband designing things like Instagram, twitter etc.

Maybe the best advice here would be to keep track of which subject areas you've studied and which areas that you've organically produced a solution to make sure you've covered everything!
